Land off Old Croft Road

The Planning Application for 40 dwellings at land off Old Croft Road was turned down by Stafford Borough Council's planning committee on 21 February 2023 for many reasons including that the applicant had not demonstrated a defined need for housing in the location, it would undermine community bonds, there was insufficient information about access visibility and the proximity to Cannock Chase Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. All the documents relating to the application can be viewed through the Planning Public Access page on the SBC website. We will keep an eye out for any future appeals.

Walton Coppice Update

The Parish Council have been successful in obtaining a grant to plant and reinforce the boundary hedge around Walton Coppice to improve security, biodiversity and the range of habitat. The hedgerow will be a great benefit to the site boundary as it will provide continuity of habitat and make it easier for wildlife to further colonise the area. A condition of the grant funding is that the work is complete before the end of March 2023 so watch this space!

School Lane Trees

Following a tree condition report commissioned by the Parish Council last year, a road closure has been applied for to allow work to be done to the trees along School Lane, Walton on the Hill. It is hoped

that the work can be undertaken on 19 and 20 April 2023 and that it will be complete within two working days.

Four diseased trees are due to be felled and removed, and other trees are due to be reduced by 3m in height. We know the trees are an important part of the character of the lane and wish to prolong the life of the healthy trees. The contractors who will be undertaking the work are liaising with the Highways Authority and electricity network on our behalf.



Parish Council Elections Parish Council Elections are held every four years and 2023 is an election year. People who wish to be Parish Councillors must complete nomination forms and submit them to Stafford Borough Council's Returning Officer by 4pm on Tuesday 4 April. Berkswich Parish Council has 10 seats so if there have been 10 or less nominations there is no need for a poll to be held, all nominees become councillors. If there are 11 or more nominations, a poll will I be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.
